
## Accidentals vs Key Signatures

Let's practise writing scales **EITHER** with a key signature (which goes at the beginning) **OR** with an accidental (which goes next to the note). Read each question carefully!


- 1. Write the scale of G major:
- ★ use accidentals NOT the key signature
- \* use semibreves
- \* write one octave descending
- \* mark the tones



- 2. Write the scale of F major:
  - ★ write the key signature
  - \* write one octave going up (also known as 'ascending')
  - **★** use crotchets
  - ★ mark each semitone with a slur



- 3. Write the scale of F major:
- \* use the bass clef
- \* use accidentals
- ★ write one octave ascending
- ★ use minims



- 4. Write the scale of G major:
- ★ use the treble clef
- ★ write the key signature
- ★ use semibreves
- write one octave descending
- \* mark each semitone with a slur
